Your SMSC ID badge should be visibly displayed at all times inside the fenced-in (range) areas.

Eye and ear protection is required for everyone inside the fenced-in area at all times.

SMSC is for the use of members only. A single membership permits bringing one, escorted guest for no additional charge. Additional guests must purchase a daily pass (\$20 each). Guests are the responsibility of the escorting member, and must follow all SMSC rules and the posted SOPs. Guests must leave when the escorting member leaves. Unsafe conditions will not be tolerated. Members and guests may be asked to leave the range if rules violations or unsafe conditions are observed. Only those who have taken the Safety Orientation or who are guests of a member who has taken the Safety Orientation are allowed on the range. **Do not let anyone, other than your one, personal guest, through the gates.**
