COVERED AT THIS MONTH'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The July board of directors meeting will be held at 7PM on July 11, at the SMSC clubhouse. Members are welcome to participate. Non-members wishing to address the board are welcome to attend through the Non-Member Business portion of the meeting.

Financial information was posted in the clubhouse: At this time last year, we were in the red about \$7000. This year, we are \$6000 in the black. Our \$80,000 certificate of deposit, earning 2.25% APR, will mature in mid-April 2020.

General Operations Information: The lawn mower was repaired. Mark has found dirt for the berm improvement. The trees near the parking lot and garage have been removed. Mark was approved to rent a stump grinder to remove the stumps from those trees. Mark is clearing the trail behind the berm, and has almost completed it, except for one large tree that needs to be removed. He need assistance -- any volunteers?? Contact Mark.

Re: Allowing a politically-oriented group of non-members to use the ranges - discussed in May BoD meeting: Our legal counsel advises:

- If we allow any group to use the range, we cannot discriminate against other, similar groups.
- We must require a Certificate of Insurance from each group, naming SMSC and the entire Board as co-insured for the event. (This will be expensive.)
- Further discussion and final decision to be made during the July BoD meeting.

SMTC Water Leakage Concerns: The slope of the drive is causing water leakage at the SMTC. B Rognholt will follow up with the county engineer to ask the county for a long-term solution to effectively redirect the water.

Waiver Box: H Melville added a waiver box at the gate.

Indoor Range Air Quality: H Melville to contact Nagel Heating & Air for an estimate for the work we need.

Bowling Pin Shoot - our ever-resourceful range manager has provided us with an abundance of bowling pins. It has been several years since we have done bowling pin shoots at SMSC and it is high time that we bring it back. On July 6th from 10 am until

dusk, members of SMSC may participate in the first of what we hope will be many bowling pin shoots. The plate range area will be used for this event. From a distance of 21 feet, a pistol shooter will see how fast they can knock a set of bowling pins off of a table. Because they do not penetrate the pins well, wadcutters rounds are restricted from the pin shoot but everything else from .22 up to a .500 round would be acceptable. This initial event is free to all SMSC members. We hope to open this up as a competition event to non-members with entry fees imposed and prizes awarded in the future.

You are responsible to keep your email address current. The club uses email and the club website (www.smsclub.org) EXCLUSIVELY to communicate with members. Please add this address to your list of approved email addresses. You must have a valid email address on file to be notified of your renewal date. Change in membership/guest details:

Membership is for the member ONLY. The member's spouse or partner, who shares the same address per information on their driver's licenses, may have their own badge for range access if they pay the badge fee (\$10), complete the Safety Orientation, and provide a completed Waiver.

If you bring a guest/guests, you are responsible for them and their actions while on the range. Badge holders must supervise and take responsibility for their guests at all times. They are legally responsible for any damage caused by themselves or their guests, including the consequences of any bullet fired.

Each guest (including children) must provide SMSC with a signed and dated waiver form before using the range. Parents must sign the waiver for each child. You may download and print the waiver form before coming to the range at:

<https://www.smsclub.org/wp-content/uploads/2016/01/waiver.pdf>, or get a copy of the waiver from the box at the gate, and complete it before entering the fenced area of the range.

Provide the Range Manager with the waiver before entering the range.

Guests: Badge holders may bring family members as guests to the range. Up to three non-family guests are also permitted. All guests must be known to the badge holder.

No more than three firing points can be used by the badge holder and guests, and all three firing points (lanes) must be adjacent. The badge holder and guests must stay together at all times.

Every person in the group must have turned in a signed waiver. Minors must have the waiver signed by a parent or guardian.

Club WiFi guest password is "clubhouse" (without quotation marks).

Every member is responsible to know, follow, and enforce firearms safety and all posted rules at all times. We suggest you regularly review our Standard Operating Procedures (S.O.P.), you can download them from [here](#).

To keep everyone safe, members who violate any posted range rule will receive a warning on their first offense. The second offense will result in range access suspension until review with the Board of Directors for the purpose of reaching a decision regarding when to allow access again.

Do not let anyone through the gate with you, either coming in or going out, other than your own family or your personal guests. **Every member must badge in and out.** Your SMSC ID badge should be visibly displayed at all times inside the fenced-in (range) areas. **You must also badge out of the range!** This is to help ensure we know who is using the range. Be sure that you do not allow anyone to "tailgate" when entering OR LEAVING the range. Everyone should badge in and out. Do this for your own protection.

Eye and ear protection is required at all times for everyone inside the fenced-in area.

Before driving to the range, check the on-line calendar at <https://www.smsclub.org/calendar> to ensure that the range is open and that no special event is scheduled.

If you require handicapped access to the range, contact our range manager. The range is now locked, and is normally accessible only through the badge-reader-controlled gate just east of the clubhouse. You can check out a key for the gate on the west side should you require it. Old keys (issued prior to April, 2018) will not work.
