

### Let's start off with a look back on 2020 (and 2019)

Although the global pandemic impacted everyone's lives in ways we couldn't have imagined at the outset, SMSC has been able to stay open as usual. This is because, as one wise gentleman put it, "We are a park that allows you to shoot." We were able to provide our services more or less as usual. However, we were not able to continue our practice of having large, in-person orientation classes. This posed a problem for us, people needed activities like a day at the range more than ever with their options for experiences outside the home being so limited. Our solution was to move our training and new member process online. Potential new members view a training video, take a proficiency test to ensure they retained the essential information and are able to ask questions via email or our forum. This allows us to continue to accept new members and they can go through the process where they are and whenever it is convenient for them. We still have the option for one-on-one orientations for those who are not able to utilize the online experience. The result has been a very positive experience. We have maintained a level of membership to keep our club viable and the feedback from the people using the new process has been positive. If you know someone who is interested in rifle, shotgun, pistol, revolver shooting or archery, please direct them to our website, there is no obligation or cost to go through the training exercise.



### New Home

In 2019 the state of the range manager's home was such that it was time to replace it. The mobile home had far outlived its life expectancy and replacement was long overdue. The board investigated the options to build a traditional home, cabin or purchase a new mobile home. The latter option was the choice that made the most sense from a practical and financial sense. With a lot of work from our range manager himself and our members, the new home was installed and amenities



added. The new home has a separate entrance for the office so that the range manager is able to get some separation of public and private spaces. This fall with the help of our volunteers, we trimmed the trees around the trailer so that the roof will not be shaded all day long. This will prevent the sort of moisture damage that occurred with the older trailer.



# Range Improvements

In 2019 we improved the drainage around the east shed to prevent water from seeping into the shed.





Last year the same area was landscaped to prevent further erosion in the area



The pistol berm was covered with a layer of mulch to better absorb bullets



In the fall of 2020, we were able to get an excellent price on fill. We received 52 truckloads of fill and used it to build the height of our berm. The berm is now twice the height that it was. While we haven't measured it yet, it should be close the height recommended by the NRA for a berm. We hope to get as good a deal this spring and build it a bit higher.



The archery range also got a number of improvements in 2020. The trails were groomed, some of the unused ones where removed. The large targets near the 'tree stand' were replaced with new targets. While I don't 'arch?' whatever the verb is for what archers do...I did enjoy several nice walks in the woods on the paths last summer.



## 2020 All Members Meeting Postponed

The 2020 All Members meeting had to be postponed due to the pandemic restrictions. We did put out requests for nominations for the board of directors and we had only 4 nominations, exactly enough to fill the open positions. While they haven't yet been voted on by the membership, we have
