We held our annual cleanup/fixup day on May 14, 2022 and combined it again with our annual all member meeting. After a review of our range's safety protocols, we decided to use the metal target hangers on the pistol range again. There is little to no chance of a ricochet from one of them leaving our property. The wooden hangers were replaced with metal ones as part of the fix up. We also reconditioned the archery targets which have seen a lot of use of late.

The annual meeting was well attended and there was a proposed change to the club bylaws that was passed unanimously by all those in attendance. This change adds a 'Hold harmless' clause to the existing indemnification clauses to protect those working on the clubs behalf from litigation. The following volunteers were elected to serve 3-year terms on our board of directors: Ron Carlson, Delane Morris, Johnathan Holmes and Gregory Kemple. On our next clean up day in 2023, we would like to host an open house of sorts to invite the public out to see our facilities while there isn't any shooting activity going on.

Last year we had a few instances where we shut down our ranges to investigate the possibility of rounds leaving our ranges. We did not find any evidence that this happened. We have taken a number of precautions to prevent ricochets and the overhead baffles on the pistol and falling plate ranges do a great job of keeping bullets on our property. This year we hired a professional range assessment company to review and assess our ranges and trap area. We will be reviewing the results of that assessment and taking any required and recommended steps to increase the safety of our range for our members and our neighbors.

As part of the upgrades, we intend to increase and improve our camera system to the point where we can definitively prove that a round did not leave our range at any given point in time. I want to thank all those who have volunteered to help with this. We haven't forgotten you, it is just taking more time than expected to gather the information we need to get it right.

Your club holds board meetings on the first Thursday of each month and all members are welcome to attend and provide input and feedback.
